


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
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Note: This project was focused specifically on young women. However, the survey was free to fill in for all genders and ages.


TARGET GROUP SUMARY



of young international women from Gen Z are not comfortable openly talk about menstruation



of interviewed women experienced period shaming



feel that there is still a stigma around menstruation

To sum up the research, most of the participants feel that there is still a stigma around menstruation. 40% of young international women from Gen Z are not comfortable openly talk about menstruation. One-quarter of participants stated that raising awareness that period is a natural thing helped/would help them to open up about menstruation. As one of the participants said 'We are thought to hide it or feel ashamed about it, men are thought to see it as disgusting'.

30% of interviewed women experienced period shaming, such as' male teacher: "Can't you just wait to go? I'm teaching right now'. Almost half of the interviewees wish topic menstruation would become a topic, which is commonly discussed in public, ex. 'I wish it was seen as more normal and not taboo to talk about, and wasn't met with disgusted faces', 'I hate pad and tampon commercials with the blue water'.

TARGET GROUP HIGHLIGHTS

'Frustration that no one talks about it. My menstruation being particularly bad and impacting my life, requiring cancelations of any plans during.'





WHY DO YOU BELIEVE THERE IS A STIGMA AROUND MENSTRUATION?

I feel like it is still seen as "gross" or "private" so although I talk about it with my girlfriend and closest friends, I still feel the need to hide it especially as a trans man

People mainly see it as an "icky girly thing" that's not to be spoken of in polite company. As a trans man, it's especially hard to communicate about mine.

It's getting better for cis women, I think. But for LGBTQIA+ people, not so much.

IS THERE SOMETHING THAT YOU WOULD LIKE TO CHANGE ABOUT THE WAY MENSTRUATION IS (NOT) DISCUSSED IN PUBLIC?


I think it would be helpful to degender menstruation because it's still seen as a "girl thing" to the point where some trans women are telling people they have periods because they are girls. Men can get periods too, it doesn't make anyone any more or less of a woman regardless of whether you have one or not. If it was degendered, there would be less stigma for trans men to talk about third periods.

People gotta get over themselves and let people talk about it. It's not icky, it's just a thing that happens.

More affordable reusable gender-neutral products. I don't have \$30 to \$50 all at once for a single pair of period boxer briefs, and I'd need several for the whole cycle. A package of 24 super heavy overnight pads can be less than \$6 at Dollar General. I also want less feminine wrappers. Not pink and flowery or lacy designs. How about some spaceships, or cars, or sharks, or dinosaurs? Nobody should have to be afraid and not know where he's going to throw away his used product in the men's restroom, and worry if putting it in the paper towel bin will get him assaulted because there's no trash cans in stalls. Something needs to change to make menstruating safer in public. I have to keep plastic bags and carry my trash home with me. That's what needs to change about menstruation in general. As far as just how it's talked about, everyone should really be included in the conversation. To be left out because of your gender is awful.
